



FCC USA: Youth Soccer Program Manager/Coach

About FCC: Since 2007 Futbol Con Corazón (FCC) has used soccer's power to provide new life opportunities for both children and young adults in conflict and poverty-afflicted communities. FCC is a grass-roots organization that has developed an extra-curricular program to instill four core values and fourteen social and emotional skills in children and young adults ages 5 -16.

Position Title & Description: Youth Soccer Program Manager & Coach To provide an enjoyable and safe experience for at-risk youth children while they learn both individual life skills, team and game skills, sportsmanship, and fair play.

Responsibilities.

- Coaching: teach, with an assistant coach, an assigned group of children, 120-160, soccer fundamentals emphasizing the FCC's core skills development, in addition to safety, fair play, sportsmanship, and fun. Teach and integrate the 4 FCC's core life skills and 14 attributes using the game of soccer and the FCC's methodology.
- Supervising: Preside over activities including all scheduled practices and games.
- Be responsible for team equipment and for the set-up of soccer fields using portable goals and cones. The ability to lift and move 40lbs.
- Compliance: Adhere to FCC policies, objectives, and rules and lead by example.
- Administrative: upload data into FCC proprietary software systems, maintain excel spreadsheets and attendance and records of participants.
- Reporting: Send weekly reports to the Executive Director.
- Meetings: Conduct weekly calls with parents to discuss their child's progress, make them aware of any issues, and encourage their participation in parenting workshops hosted monthly by FCC. Attend weekly calls with the FCC Headquarters in Columbia and immediate supervisor. Conduct daily meetings with assistance coaches to ensure program alignment current and in compliance.
- Document and report any illegal activity immediately to the supervisor, Executive Director, Authorities and Park Manager.

Qualifications:

Required:

- Minimum 18 years of age.
- Three years working with children in after school programs, soccer athletic programs, or in a scholastic setting.
- Bilingual and completely fluent /reading/ writing (Spanish & English),
- High School Degree.
- A valid passport and ability to travel to Colombia for training (1 week in February 2020)
- Current CPR/ First Aid certification.

- Computer skills: ability to use MS word, PowerPoint, and Excel.
- Ability to use email, smartphones, search engines and other software.
- Learn and execute FCC's methodology and adhere to FCC standards.
- *Other duties as assigned.

Preferred:

- A bachelor's in education, physical education, health, psychology, social work, or related field. A desire to work with children, a former soccer player who has exhibited leadership roles or has leadership experience.

Supervision: Reports to Operations Director and Executive Director

Time Commitment: 3pm – 7pm Monday through Thursday, and either Fridays or Saturday 3 hours for tournaments.

Location: Delevoe Park Ft. Lauderdale FL

Policy on Background Checks: The FCC follows performs reference checks and background checks on all coaching staff.

Resources: Coaches are required to attend an initial training at FCC Headquarters in Colombia for 1week and will receive ongoing support throughout the lifetime of the program.
